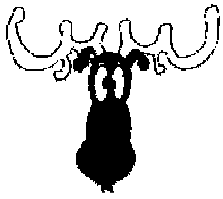

## **A MUST READ!!!!**

### **THE IMPORTANCE OF THE “FIVE C’s”**

When I was appointed to the Moose International Public Relations/Publications Committee the assignment also included teaching publication seminars throughout the western United States. During my tenure with this assignment I was introduced to many Moose Lodges and hundreds of Officers and Committee persons in the Loyal Order and the Women of the Moose. I discovered in every lodge the inability for members to get along, especially the boards of Officers, both the men and women. In addition, there was a huge lack of communication and a blatant sign of irresponsibility. I look back on those days and was so happy that my lodge, Yuba City Moose Lodge 1204 and WOTM Chapter 1089 did not fit in the category of most of the Fraternity. We had compassion and everyone basically got along. The Men and Women worked together to accomplish their goals. We were indeed a happy, content Moose family. That atmosphere is not the same today.

Years ago while I was working for the California Department of Transportation I took on the volunteer job as District Disabled Advisory Chairman. Six years later I was running the entire state as the Caltrans State Disabled Advisory Chairperson. As I continued through the chairs to the top position I observed many problems within the organization pertaining to accomplishments, volunteering and communications. When I took the helm I immediately went to work, created and submitting guidelines to the group. I named the guidelines **THE FIVE C’s** and the unpleasant atmosphere changed almost overnight. Those guidelines are still in effect today.

Perhaps it is time for Yuba City to look at what can be done to improve our relationships, our cooperation and the understanding of how important communication is to any organization. The following are the same Five C’s for all members of our lodge, including Board of Officers, to look at and hopefully use as a guide to improve our relationships with each other and at the same time benefit our lodge and chapter, to once again come together working as one unit for the good of all.

**COMPASSION:** Sympathetic consciousness of others feeling, ideas or abilities.

**COURTESY:** Courteous behavior along with general allowance despite facts. A courteous act of expression.

**COOPERATION:** The association of a person for the common benefit of all.

**CONSIDERATION:** Considerate and careful thought before one acts or speaks, thoughtful and sympathetic regards.

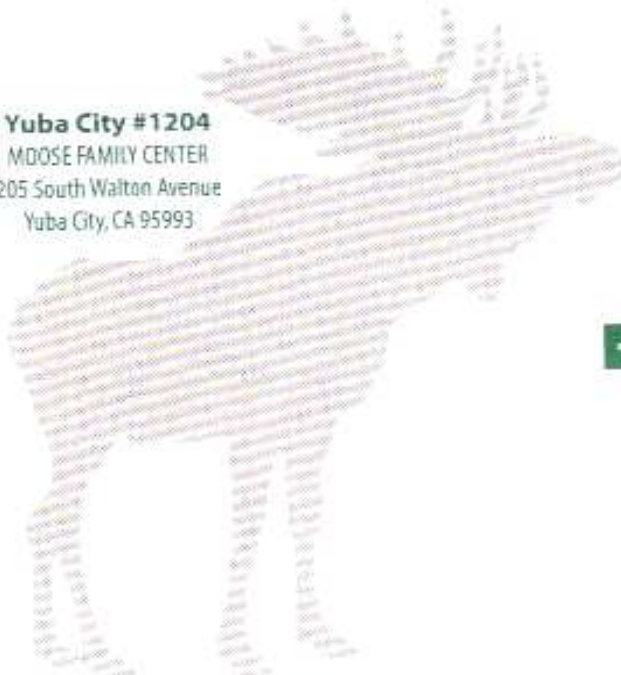
